## Jacoby Transfers

## What is a Jacoby Transfer?

- A bidding convention over partner's 1NT (15-17 HCPs) opener.
- $2 \checkmark$ Transfer, showing $5+$ hearts and any strength. The 1 NT opener must bid $2 \vee$.
- $2 \boldsymbol{\vee}=$ Transfer, showing $5+$ spades and any strength. The 1NT opener must bid 2 $\downarrow$.
-When responder bids $2 \diamond$ or $2 \vee$, partner must say "Transfer" to inform opponents.
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## Why Use Jacoby Transfer?

- Allows the 1NT hand to play the contract, often an advantage.
- Allows responder to invite game after the transfer when they have 8-9 HCP.

Responder's Rebids after the Jacoby Transfer (Shown for a heart transfer, similar for spades)

- Pass $=$ Weak hand ( $0-7$ pts. ).
- $2 \mathrm{NT}=$ Invitational ( $8-9 \mathrm{HCP}$ ) to $4 \checkmark$ or 3 NT , exactly 5 cards in your suit.
- $3 \mathrm{NT}=$ Game values for $4 \vee$ or 3 NT , exactly 5 cards in your suit.
- $3 \downarrow$ = Invitational to $4 \vee$ (8-9 support points), 6 or more cards in your suit.
- $4 \boldsymbol{\vee}=$ Game values, 6 or more cards in your suit.
- New suit = Forcing to game, showing a second suit.

Opener's Rebids (Shown for a heart transfer, similar for spades)
When deciding contract strain, always choose partner's major if you have 3+-card support. If partner's rebid was invitational, you must also show your strength by choosing the right level. If responder transfers and rebids 2NT (invitational), you should:

- Pass with a minimum opening ( 15 pts .) and 2-card support for partner's suit.
- Bid $3 \checkmark$ with 15 pts. and 3-card support.
- Bid 3NT with 16-17 pts. and 2-card support.
- Bid $4 \checkmark$ with $16-17$ pts. and 3 -card support.


## Over 2NT Openings

You can also use transfers after partner opens $2 \mathrm{NT}(3 \checkmark$ to show $5+$ hearts, $3 \checkmark$ to show $5+$ spades). After the transfer, responder can:

- Pass with a weak hand (0-3 HCP).
- Raise to 4 of the major with game values (4-5+ support points) and a $6+$-card suit.
- Rebid 3NT with game values and a 5 -card suit.
- Bid a new suit to show a strong, two-suited hand.
