Rebids by Opener

Important: When you decide to open, you should consider what your possible rebid will be.

Types of Hands for Opener

Minimum Hand $\sim 12 - 14$ Intermediate Hand $\sim 15 - 18$ Maximum Hand $\sim 19 +$

Opener Rebidding Her Suit

Points	Suit Length	Rebid
12 - 14	6+	Two of Suit
16+	6+	Three of Suit*
18+	7+	Four of suit after
		partner's raise

^{*}Why is it important for opener to jump? Partner is the smartest person in the room and it is important that opener show the value of her hand so that responder, as Captain, can determine the best contract!!!!

Notes:

- 1. Rebidding your suit promises an additional card ~ six in a major and depending upon *partnership agreement*, at least five in a minor!!! (I like this to show six as well!!!!!)
- 2. Rebidding a new suit shows at least four cards in that suit!!!
- 3. Rebid indicates the strength of the hand!!!
- 4. Rebids that indicate a minimum hand may be passed!!!

Rebids by Opener to Show Minimum Hand

- 1. Rebid of NT at cheapest level
- 2. Rebid of Opener's suit at the cheapest level
- 3. Raising Responder's suit at the cheapest level
- 4. Rebid of a suit lower in rank than opening bid

Rebids by Opener to Show Intermediate Hand

- 1. Rebid of jump in suit (1♠ 3♠)
- 2. Raising Responder's suit 2 levels
- 3. Reversing in a new suit (If playing 2/1, this is a <u>partnership agreement!!!</u>) First suit MUST BE LONGER than the second suit!!!! Shows at least 16+ HCPs and is FORCING!!!!
- 4. Rebidding 2 NT after 1-level overcall

Rebids by Opener to Force to Game

- 1. Rebid of Jump Shift
- 2. Reversing in a new suit (If playing 2/1, this is a *partnership agreement*!!!) First suit **MUST BE LONGER** than the second suit!!!! Shows at least 16+ HCPs and is **FORCING**!!!
- 3. Rebid of Game after Responder's 1-level bid (This is an **OBVIOUS** force to game!!!)
- 4. Bid 3 NT if balanced (Another **OBVIOUS** force to game!!!)

Types of Hands for Responder

Minimum Hand $\sim 6 - 9$ Invitational Hand $\sim 10 - 12$ Game Forcing $\sim 13 +$

What if my partner (Responder) bids notrump over my opening bid?

What are Responder's bids that Opener can pass?

Rebids by Responder	What bid means	
Raise Opener's suit	Minimum Hand!! Nothing else to

Rebidding Own Suit	Minimum Hand!! 5+ card suit	

How can Responder invite Opener to game?

Rebids by Responder	What bid means	
Jump in own suit	Invitational hand; 6+ card suit	
2 NT to opener's rebid of 1 NT	Invitational, balanced hand	
Bidding 2 NT over 2 nd suit	Invitational, balanced hand	
Bidding the fourth suit**	Usually game-forcing MUST BE	
	ALERTED ; fourth-suit forcing!!	
	Does not promise this suit!!!	

Is this all there is to Rebids? The short answer is NO!! This will, however, get you started!! Remember that you are trying to determine the BEST contract!!! That does not always mean bidding game!!! Pay attention to your partner's bids!!! They tell you a very compelling story!!!

NOTE: Don't be afraid to bid!! The worst possible thing that can happen is if you get a "bad" board!! The world will not end!! Do not be afraid to make a mistake!!! If you never make a mistake, you will not learn!!!
