Bob Jones 3NT Nine high-card points and a five-card suit are worth forcing to game. Bid 3NT.

Steve Vogel 290 Some may view this hand, with 9 HCP and a 5-card club suit, as worth a direct raise to 3 NT . It's a close call, but given the lack of intermediates, I would choose to go low at matchpoints, starting with 2e (Stayman) and following up with 2NT as invitational to 3NT. At IMPS, I would bid 3NT.

Joe Muenks 2 $\mathbf{2 \boldsymbol { s }}$ Standard players bid 2NT, which is what I'll bid next playing 4 suit transfers. Though I have a 5-card suit and the J is with the A, I won't upgrade to 10 for a direct raise to $3 N T$ since the $J$ is in a doubleton and setting up the clubs might require losing the lead twice.

Bob Fisk $\quad \underline{\mathbf{2 s}}$ I play 4-suit transfers, so the only way that I can invite to 3NT is by going through Stayman. This hand is close to a game force, but not quite. T9x xx AJT ATxxx? Yup.

Steve Moese $3 \underline{3}$ - or 2NT, whatever my Puppet/5-card Major Stayman convention is. Not have one? then 3NT. We might be missing out on a 5-3 M fit that plays better.

Bob Jones 14 When you can make your normal response at the one level, ignore the take out double. Bid 14

Steve Vogel 19 I would not let an opponent's takeout double distract from the normal response of 1 $\mathbf{~}$.

Joe Muenks 19 Epls, I can ignore that double like it never happened. Also, partner can get a support double in (3 card support) should West bid a minor and now we've found our 8 card major.

Bob Fisk 14 Not quite a redouble, since (1) we're vulnerable and they aren't and (2) I have a biddable Spade suit and tolerance for partner's Hearts. Picture partner with xx KQJTxx Jxx Ax, making three while the opponents are likely cold for 3\% (no Spade ruff, since West has a doubleton Spade).

Steve Moese 14 Forcing one round. This hand is not quite worth a penalty redouble. A Pass is either too timid or blind.

Bob Jones $3 \boldsymbol{3}$ Some would bid 2\&, but why give your opponents the 2-level when you can take it away? Bid 3e.

Steve Vogel Pass I view my hand as too strong (and too supportive of spades) for a $2^{\text {nd }}$ seat club preempt, but what about an immediate overcall of $2 \boldsymbol{\aleph}$ ? It's close, and while the modern approach may be to make that bid, if I did so, partner would surely count on me for a stronger hand. I may come to regret it, but I would pass

Joe Muenks 29 We'd much prefer to have 2 defensive tricks for our overcall, rather than 1.5 , but we have too much to preempt and passing is not a reasonable option.

Bob Fisk $\quad \underline{\mathbf{2 s}} \quad$ I'd bid $3 \boldsymbol{e}$ if it weren't for my QJx in Spades (i.e., I want to leave room for partner to show their Spade suit). Partner will think I have more in HCP, but my extra Club more than makes up for that. Picture partner with KTxxx xx Axx xxx making 4d if the opponents forget to get their Club ruff.

Steve Moese 4오 Exert pressure. Perhaps you've heard of the rule of 2-3-4-5. Subtract the number of losers (6) from 13 (7) then add 2 if vul and they are not, 3 if both vul, 4 if both not vul, and 5 if they are vul and we are not (This modification of the rule of 2-3-4 was proposed for Weak Jump Overcalls by Alan Truscott -who am I to argue). Some say the rule is too conservative. Our total is 12 , but we stop at the 4 -level(10). Maximum pressure at favorable vulnerability needn't be too reckless.
2\%, 3\%,4\%, and 5\% are all possible here. In Matchpoints I lean toward $4 / 5 \%$, in teams $2 \boldsymbol{\%}$ is enough to start, intending to bid as high as 5 if necessary. We might have a spade game. Note that the first two hands have at least half of the HCP $(12+9)$. That leaves 10 each on average for seats 3 and 4. Game either way is NOT certain. With a weaker hand we would bid more. We succeed in three ways: makes, $4 \boldsymbol{2}$ goes down less than their partial or game, or we push them into an unmakeable game at the 4-level. $5 \boldsymbol{1}$ wins only when they have game or slam and fail to bid on.

Bob Jones 14 5-5 come alive! This hand is well worth an opening bid. Bid 1 .

Steve Vogel 19 A good 10 HCP, 5-5 in the majors and decent intermediates. I would open this hand at any vulnerability.

Joe Muenks Pass This fails the rule of 20/22 (my guide) or the rule of 20 for those who play that even more aggressive form. With both majors locked up there's a very high chance you'll be into the bidding next time around.

Bob Fisk Pass Idon't open this hand.

Steve Moese 14 Rule of 22 says Cards in 2 longest suits plus HCP plus QTs $\geq 22$, open the bidding. We have 21.5 here and all HCP working. We love the Major suits!

Bob Jones $\underline{\mathbf{X}} \quad$ Start with a negative double. You might find a heart fit, plus your subsequent diamond bid will be non-forcing.

Steve Vogel $\underline{X}$ We are vulnerable, and I have a void in partner's suit. To me, this calls for caution, bit with a good diamond suit and 4 hearts, I feel there is more risk in passing. If partner rebids spades, I would then bid 3 which should describe my hand (and hopefully will not be too high).

Joe Muenks Pass Your bid is probably influenced by your style and system. If I negative double and bid diamonds next I'll deliver a game forcing hand. If I bid 2 now I'll deliver 10 HCP or almost that and spade tolerance. If I pass now and pull partner's reopening double to $3>$, I can be weak with long diamonds -- bingo. If I pass now and bid 3 over partner's 24, I'm weak without spades and with at least 7 diamonds -- bingo. If I pass now and bid 3 if west competes to $3 \%$ or bids 2 with $10+$ support points, I'm weak with at least 7 diamonds -- bingo.

Bob Fisk $\underline{\mathbf{X}} \quad$ I'm a bit light on HCP for a 2-level Negative double, but I don't mind playing in 4D if the auction gets away from me. 14-(2@)-Double-(3\&); 34-(Pass)-4 .

Steve Moese $\underline{\mathbf{X}} \quad$ Majors first. If we bid diamonds later, partner will expect a longer suit. A 3 preempt in competition will lose a possible Heart fit. Some play fit jumps in competition so a preempt is unavailable.

Bob Jones 3 Partner is asking if you are minimum or maximum. You have a maximum, albeit flawed. Show the max by bidding $3 \$$.

Steve Vogel 39 My partners and I play Ogust in this auction, and I view my hand as a maximum with a good heart suit (2 out of the top 3 honors, or perhaps 3 out of the top 5).

Joe Muenks 34 Playing OGUST, I'll call this a good hand with a good suit, though perhaps the suit isn't great but "good" normally is 2 of the top 3 or 3 of the top 5 , so I do have that. If you're playing feature, I'd bid $4 \vee$ indicating a game hand with no feature, almost always with a singleton K or doubleton QJ. Note 2NT with my partners always shows a heart fit and is never a probing bid that can be short in hearts.

Bob Fisk 39 I play Modified Ogust with my regular partners at this vulnerability, so my 3 ${ }^{1}$ bid says that I have a good hand and a good suit (actually, that one is the same as regular Ogust).

Steve Moese 39 Ogust (Good hand, good suit). 3- - Feature, 3- - Singleton. Depends on our agreements.
