Steve Vogel Pass My diamond honors are poorly placed (in front of opener), and my strength in the unbid suits ( 5 points) is not enough to make a takeout double. My partners and I will reopen the bidding when appropriate in passout seat, but I see no need for action at this point.

Joe Muenks Pass Because I have 13 cards is no reason to bid every hand with a couple of points. We like to aggressively balance but at this point we might give away distribution to the opponents if we take any action.

Bob Fisk Pass This isn't quite the right hand to sneak in a passed-hand double or Sandwich NT bid. Change my hand slightly to x KJxx xxx AJxxx, and I happily bid 1NT. I like to play that a 1NT bid by a passed hand in the "sandwich position" shows exactly five cards in the lower-ranking unbid suit and four in the higher-ranking unbid suit. A double in the same position by a passed hand shows 5-4 in the higher/lower unbid suits respectively. With 5-5 shape, bid 2NT.

Steve Moese Pass Sure, I have 4-4 in the round suits, but my diamond values are not pulling full weight in this auction.

Bob Jones 3NT There is no slam, there is no fit, so don't waste time. Bid 3NT.

Steve Vogel 2 I am not yet sure of our best contract, and I need more information from partner. The best way to do this is to make a forcing bid. I could bid $2 \boldsymbol{4}$, but that would suggest longer hearts, and partner has already denied 4 spades. I believe the best bid for now is 2 .

Joe Muenks 3NT Values, stoppers, no slam aspirations given a mismatch with partner's hand. Note, too, I woulda responded 1 with such a strong hand bidding up the line with fours. (We pass over diamonds with 6-10 points since we have a one-bid hand and do not want to miss an 8-card major.)

Bob Fisk 3NT Partner doesn't have four spades or four hearts, so there's no reason to prolong the auction. Bid what you think you can make (i.e., bid what you think others can make if you're not that good at declaring).

Steve Moese 3NT Partner has a minimum and might have 4 diamonds on this auction, but cannot have a 4-card Major. NT simply scores better.

Mike Ma 3NT Opener has denied 4 spades, and your side don't have enough for slam with the club misfit. So 3NT should be your contract. The only consideration is who should declare. With your hand, it may be better for north to play 3NT. E.g. if she has Qx. You may be able to do that with a $2 \diamond$ artificial forcing bid. The flip side is you will give opps info to defend.

Bob Jones 3NT Partner has shown a minimum, so give up on slam. Which game should you bid, 3 NT or $5 \geqslant$ ? We like 3 NT.

Steve Vogel 3NT If partner has the $\$ \mathcal{K Q}$ and $A \vee$, we belong in 6NT. Partner's 3 rebid denies a strong holding like that. Given that, I believe 3NT will most often be our best spot.

Joe Muenks 6-What was 2NT, usually they tell us, so I'm guessing here that partner is showing a good suit. In most partnerships we bid $4 \boldsymbol{\xi}$ over 2 which is poor man's keycard so learn about $\geqslant A$ and $\forall A K Q$, stopping in $5 \diamond$ if slam isn't there.

Bob Fisk 3NT Partner doesn't have AKQxxx, since they would have bid 3NT over 2NT. Partner doesn't have the $\vee$ A, since they would have bid $3 \vee$ over 2NT to show a feature (that's the default interpretation of 2NT in these quizzes). Even if partner has a magic hand ( xx Jx AKxxxx xxx), diamonds still have to be 2-2 (or 3-1 with a stiff Queen) to make six.

Steve Moese 3NT We assume partner has shown a minimum hand. Ours is just enough to have good play for 3NT.

Mike Ma N/A I don't know what 2NT and 3 mean, and why south did not bid $2 \boldsymbol{V}$. Personally I would have bid $4 \stackrel{\text { ever }}{2}$ as preempt BW. If partner shows or 1 without queen, I would sign off in 4NT. Otherwise I would put us in 6 .

Bob Jones 3 You have much to do, perhaps ending in a grand slam. Start with 3 , showing a club fit and at least invitational values.

Steve Vogel $\underline{\mathbf{X}} \quad$ I believe my best two options are a takeout double and cuebidding $3 \diamond$. Yes, $4^{-}$is an option, but I believe that takes up too much space. Clubs is very likely our best spot, but partner could be 4-4-2-3 on this auction, so I am inclined to make a takeout double. I know some might jump all the way to $6 \%$, but I prefer to do some exploring first, at the risk of the opponents making a further preempt in diamonds.

Joe Muenks $\underline{\mathbf{X}}$ I'm not concerned partner will pass since we open most hands with both minors with 1 . I'm not concerned partner will insist upon hearts since we're likely playing 4 , 6 or 6 and $/ 7$ think I can guide us there. (Note we do not bid 3 which sets clubs as trump, possibly missing a better scoring spade contract.)

Bob Fisk 5 (Exclusion Keycard Blackwood for clubs). If partner has no keycards outside of diamonds, we'll be in 6\%. If partner shows one, I'll bid 5NT to guarantee all the keycards. If partner holds a hand similar to KQx KQx xxx Axxx, partner will bid 7\%. It helps that east is vulnerable, since they'll have a better diamond suit for their $2 \geqslant$ preempt (AKQxxxx perhaps). If partner passes my 5 with a shrug, I'll get a new partner.

Steve Moese 4-Splinter raise of clubs! Partner should show a control card (K or 0/1 suit). And we can explore slam. If partner rebids $5 \boldsymbol{\sim}$ we subside.

Mike Ma 4 I could $X$ and hope partner bids spades. But if she does not, it will become awkward. Slam is so possible that I will make immediate probe for it confirming clubs. Another option is 5 Exclusion, committing to slam, but I can't see how that helps finding about the major honors.
