Bob Jones Pass You hate it，but you have to pass．
Steve Vogel Pass My negative double（forcing to the 3－level）showed the full value of my hand．Given we have no fit，and partner showed no more than a minimum，my best choice is to pass．

Joe Muenks 3NT Pass may be prudent on this mismatch，but i go for the gusto． Nonvulnerable opponents are so frisky nowadays with their preempts and west＇s failure to raise to 3 marks partner with some length there and hopefully strength．Playing in an established partnership I bid 3s and partner bids 3NT with a half stop in spades．

Bob Fisk Pass If I held Kxx in diamonds，I＇d bid 3NT，but you know what？I don＇t hold that．I＇ve already shown 10 HCP and four hearts with my double．

Steve Moese Pass Partner says they can＇t pass for penalties，and do not have at least four cards in hearts or clubs．When you find out you are in a hole，stop digging．Now．

Mike Ma Pass What South does depends on what the negative double forces to．If it is $3 \% / \$ / \vee$ ，then you need to pass now with a minimum negative $X$ ．If opener has a hand that can make game opposite 10 points，she needs to make a stronger bid．

Bob Jones 1 We imagine a panel of experts would split evenly between pass, 1 , and $2 \star$. We like $1 \diamond$.

Steve Vogel 1 A really close one. Many would not consider opening a hand vulnerable with only 9HCP. And those who stick to the rule of 20 will pass with this hand. I like my aces, spot cards (particularly in diamonds) and 6-4 shape, and I have an easy rebid over any response by partner. On some days of the week, I would pass, but on today, Saturday, I would choose to open 1 .

Joe Muenks 1 You could pass and try to make up mileage later in the auction but I say I'll stretch now and then try to hold back partner.

Bob Fisk 1 When you're 6-4, you should add a King to your hand and bid accordingly. Picture partner with KQxx xx Kx xxxxx. Heh.

Steve Moese 1-This hand has great playing strength and two aces to boot. If you don't open these hands you are not getting out enough. Don't think about a weak two here: 1) we have 4 spades, 2) we have two aces, and 3) we have a side void. One flaw is ok, but 3? Nope.

Mike Ma 1 If the A and 9 are interchanged, I would open a super max 2 . But holding A972, I cannot preempt (although these days at our club, a side 4 Major does not seem to matter). So it is Pass or $1 \$$. This hand does not satisfy Joe's famous Role of 20/22, but surely it is better than A972, Qxx, Axxxxx, -, which does.

Bob Jones 6e You are probably not sacrificing against them. This might well be your hand. Bid $6 \boldsymbol{e}$, hoping to make. If you don't, it might be a good sacrifice.

Steve Vogel 4p There are questions of both offense and defense with this hand. On the offensive side, if partner is $3-0-5-5$, we might make slam in clubs. Given the bidding, it is likely partner has a weak distributional hand, but it wouldn't take much to make a lot of clubs (think \&A, K and nothing else and we might make 7 ). To give partner a view of my hand, I like cue bidding 4 $\mathbf{A}$. On the defensive side, I have a reasonable expectation of 2 tricks and if partner can produce one more, our opponents will not make 5 d. After my ${ }^{4}$ cue bid, I will leave it to partner to place the contract.

Joe Muenks 6e Ithink I might get a heart and a diamond against $5 \mathbf{~} \mathbf{~}$ or $\mathbf{6 d}$, so let's let the opponents guess to double or bid on, a very difficult 6 level decision.

Bob Fisk 60 I want to make the opponents make the last decision. Picture partner with $x x \times$ Kxxxx Axxxx. If clubs are 1-1, we make six. If clubs are 2-0, they make five, so 6 , down one doubled, is a good sacrifice. That's the worst case scenario. It's more likely that partner is $3-0-5-5$, and we might be missing out on a grand (not $\$ 1,000 \ldots . .$. a grand slam).

Steve Moese 6ie And I hope it's enough to make them guess last. Wouldn't disparage an enterprising 7.

Mike Ma 6e Who knows what either side can make? As little as $\mathrm{xx}, \mathrm{x}, \mathrm{Kxxxx}, \mathrm{Axxxx}$, and $6 \boldsymbol{6}$ is on if clubs breaks $1-1$ and no first round diamond ruff. If they bid $6 \mathbf{d}$ over $6 \boldsymbol{f}$, will pass showing 1st round control in spades, and let partner decide whether sacrifice/bid to make 7 . With not much strength but great distribution, there does not seem much point in doing any cue bidding. If there is a way to bid diamond for lead but not have partner think it is real I would. I also don't know how to make them let us play 6 .

Bob Jones $\quad 4 \boldsymbol{T}$ The concentration in spades is a worry, but the hand is still worth $4 \sqrt{V}$.
Steve Vogel 4- Partner's double, which is forcing to the 3-level, shows a hand which values out to 10+ points. With my 14+ points, I would choose to bid game in hearts as $3 \vee$ would show a minimum hand.

Joe Muenks 4- I think game has good play if partner has 10 pts as expected. We're almost definitely getting at least 1 ruff in each heart hand, hopefully 2 in one of them, so a suit is much better than nt even with great spades.

Bob Fisk 3NT It's likely that we're getting bad breaks, and I don't want the opponents to get a spade ruff. This might work out extremely badly if partner holds x KQxx xx KQxxxx, but if partner has that hand, I'd expect partner to bid $4 \boldsymbol{\mathcal { E }}$ over 3NT to say "You think I don't hold $x$ KQxx xx KQxxxx, but I do, so there!"

Steve Moese 4- This is not without risk. However partner's double should be an opening hand. Our spade holding strongly recommends defending. Put partner on $x$ KQ10x KQ10xx Jxx and $3 \Upsilon$ is the limit. But x KQ10x Jxx KQ9xx and we will make 10 tricks on a spade lead. Passing could yield 200 or 500 our way, but not 620.

Mike Ma Pass I have 4 tricks in my hand, 2 from partner will set it. It is not as certain as one would think. Consider if North has a hand like \#1 above with the suits rearranged to fit your hand (singleton spade). If West has 7 spades (not unreasonable for bidding 21 missing AKQ vul) and singleton heart. With better hand with North, you should set 24, but you need to set 4 to beat game score if you have game. Still, I would pass because I can win by either setting them and we not making game, or setting them more than game. In IMPS I would not pass, if $2 \Phi \times$ makes, and we make $4 \vee$ or $3 N T$, then it would be a disaster. Slam is too far fetched for me to worry about in my consideration of passing or not.

Bob Jones 39 Continue to describe your hand by bidding 3中．Should partner not bid 3NT，you might have a slam．

Steve Vogel 3－Partner＇s bid is forcing so I must take another bid．Partner＇s 3e bid pretty much denies spades（no negative double），so a spade contract is out．3NT could be best if partner has a heart stopper，as I would not normally want to play in 3NT with the only stopper being a singleton Ace（unless partner has a running club suit which I am not going to count on）．

Joe Muenks 39 Just because partner forces you to new levels，you are still forced to bid your hand．Here I have 4 spades so I＇ll bid those rather than raise clubs or rebid diamonds， which are both fine alternatives if I didn＇t have 4 spades．

Bob Fisk 34 I＇m not anxious to bid $3 N T$ with a stiff $\vee A$ ，although I would if I held Kxx in clubs，since our clubs might be running．

Steve Moese 3－Asking partner for a heart stopper for NT．You don＇t think a stiff Ace is a stopper do you？If partner shows a stop we can pass in 3NT．If not we go on to 5\％EPLS．If partner introduces 34 we have some slamming to do．

Mike Ma 39 With a single heart stopper that cannot be held up，I can＇t bid 3NT．4e bypasses $3 N T$ ．I can bid $3 \%$ for Western cue，so 3 should be for real．Even if $3 \% 100 \%$ denies 4 spades，maybe the Moysian can still be right？With a heart stopper，partiner can try 3NT over
34．

Bob Jones Pass This is a super maximum, but don't even think about bidding. Pass.

Steve Vogel Pass Am I missing something here? I chose to open 1NT (although some may have upgraded this hand to 18 points and opened $1 \boldsymbol{1}$ ), and partner placed the final contract. Nothing more to do.

Joe Muenks Pass Is there a question here or you just needed to fill space with a \#6???
Bob Fisk Pass What else? Partner did ask for my input.
Steve Moese Pass The time to upgrade is before you open, not after. Besides this hand is not the equivalent of 18 HCP. It's just a touch over 17. Yep we have 2 nice 4-card Major.
